# A WORD FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This year has reminded us why Hagar's Sisters exists. Too many Christian women continue to face abuse without a safe place to turn — and without guidance that respects both their faith and their safety. When messages of obedience or endurance are misapplied, women can feel confused, isolated, and unsure of what God desires for their lives.

At Hagar's Sisters, we walk with women through some of the hardest chapters of their story. We help them gain clarity about abuse, rebuild their confidence, and reconnect with a faith that brings freedom — not fear. And they are showing tremendous courage. 
These numbers reflect the reach and effectiveness of our programs in 2025 — from first contact to ongoing support and community. Every metric represents a woman's story moving toward hope.





### **VOLUNTEERS**

In 2025, our ministry continued to expand its capacity to walk alongside women in crisis. Two DVAC training cohorts equipped nine new volunteers — including 3 Care Coordinators in Training, 1 active Care Coordinator, 2 Group Facilitators, 2 Facilitators in Training, and 1 Special Projects volunteer. These leaders are now stepping into the work of offering safety, spiritual care, and hope.





Expanding our church outreach to equip Christian leaders with the tools to respond compassionately and biblically to domestic abuse in their congregations




Update and streamline our course experience to boost ease of use, engagement, and learning outcomes
